



Revised Notice of Public Hearing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) announces a new date for Hearing Day One on the application by Cameco Corporation (Cameco) to renew its operating licence for the Rabbit Lake Operation located in northern Saskatchewan.

Hearing Day One will take place on June 11, 2008 instead of June 10, 2008, as originally announced. Hearing Day two will be held on **September 18, 2008** in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

The current licence authorizes Cameco to operate an active underground uranium mine (Eagle Point Mine), three inactive and partially reclaimed and flooded open-pit mines (A-Zone, B-Zone and D-Zone Mines), a mill, various mine and mill waste management systems, and associated site facilities.

Hearing Day Two: September 18, 2008
Place: Delta Bessborough, 601 Spadina Crescent East, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan

The public hearing will be webcasted live on the Internet via the CNSC Web site. Public hearings follow the agenda published prior to the hearing date.

CNSC staff and Cameco's submissions to be considered at Hearing Day One will be available after May 12, 2008. The public is invited to comment on Cameco's application on Hearing Day Two. Requests to intervene must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission by August 18, 2008 at the address below. The request must include the following information, as per the *Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure*:

- a written submission of the comments to be presented to the Commission;
- a statement setting out whether the requester wishes to intervene by way of written submission only or by way of written submission and oral presentation; and
- name, address and telephone of the requester.
