# Notice of Hearing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will hold a hearing in May to consider Cameco Corporation's (Cameco) application for an amendment to its operating licence for the Key Lake Operation uranium mill. The Key Lake Operation is located in northern Saskatchewan, approximately 570 kilometres north of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

Cameco is seeking to amend its licence to provide a level of production flexibility. Cameco is requesting that the maximum annual production limit be changed to a maximum average annual production limit. This change would not result in an increase to the maximum production limit over the licence period. The proposed change is expected to reduce the overall risks associated with the environmental protection, health and safety of the Key Lake Operation.

Cameco's request is low-risk and effectively administrative in nature. It is unlikely to generate public interest. For these reasons, the Commission has determined that a public hearing is not necessary. The hearing will be conducted by way of written submissions from CNSC staff and Cameco.

Following the deliberations and decision of the Commission on this matter, a *Record of Proceedings, including Reasons for Decision* will be published on the CNSC Web site and made available to the public.
