



Revised Notice of Public Hearing

August 31, 2009

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) announces the resumption of the public hearing on the application by Cameco Corporation (Cameco) to renew its licence to possess, manage and store nuclear substances associated with the past operations of the decommissioned Beaverlodge mining and milling facility. Beaverlodge properties are located near Uranium City, Saskatchewan. Cameco has requested a three-year licence term.

The first day of the hearing was held in Ottawa, Ontario on February 18, 2009 and adjourned to a later date. The continuation of the hearing is now scheduled to be held in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

The public hearing will be webcasted live on the Internet via the CNSC Web site and archived for a period of 90 days.

Following the February 18, 2009 hearing, the Commission decided that it needed additional information from Cameco to make its decision on the licence renewal request and decided to adjourn the hearing to a later date to allow Cameco to submit this information.

The public had been invited to participate in this hearing. Five requests to intervene had been filed and permitted by the Commission. These intervenors can update their initial submission by filing a supplementary submission with the Secretary of the Commission by October 7, 2009 on-line at (<http://www.nuclearsafety.gc.ca/eng/commission/intervention/index.cfm>) or at the address below.

It should be noted that all submissions are available to the public upon request.

CNSC staff's recommendations and Cameco's additional submissions to be considered at the hearing will be available on September 8.
