



CNSC Awards and Recognition Program

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) is fully committed to showing ongoing appreciation to its employees for their efforts and accomplishments.

The CNSC's awards and recognition practices are designed to foster excellence and pride in each employee's work and to encourage individual and collective commitment to the organization's goals and objectives. These awards and recognition programs include:

• Instant Recognition	This informal recognition tool lets managers offer individuals or groups a token of appreciation when they've gone above and beyond. This non-monetary award is a timely and simple way to recognize excellence on a regular basis.
• Bravo Award	This formal recognition tool acknowledges an individual's or a group's exceptional work performance, leadership, and other significant contributions linked to the business objectives and values of the organization.
• President's Award	This award is the most prestigious honour at the CNSC. It recognizes the exceptional contributions of individuals throughout their career at the CNSC in one of three areas (technical, management and administrative) as well as sustained commitment to the CNSC's core values and objectives.
• Leadership Award	This annual award recognizes exceptional performance and achievements among CNSC managers in relation to the CNSC Leadership Competency Profiles.
• Excellence Award	<p>This annual award recognizes the exceptional contribution and performance of individuals or groups in one of three categories:</p> <p>Technical: recognizes individuals/teams who demonstrate an exceptional level of technical excellence in their respective field.</p> <p>Creativity and Innovation: recognizes individuals/teams who have advanced, through creativity and innovation, the goals and objectives of the CNSC.</p> <p>Inspiration: recognizes leadership and outstanding achievement of CNSC employees who have advanced the strategic priorities of the CNSC's and who are a source of motivation and inspiration for others.</p>
• Long Service Award	<p>The Long Service Awards enable management to extend formal recognition to employees, including part-time or seasonal employees, for long service.</p> <p>Lengths of service include: 10 years of CNSC Service, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, and 45 years of Public Service.</p>
• Retirement Recognition	This recognition tool gives the CNSC the opportunity to honour employees on the occasion of their retirement from the Public Service. Individuals who retire with 10 or more years of CNSC service, or 20 or more years in the Public Service are eligible.
