## **Re. Unable to comment on RegDoc-2.10.1 Emergency Management and Fire Protection Volume II**

To whom it may concern,

Greenpeace wished to provide constructive comments on REGDOC-2.10.1, but is unable to do so due to CNSC's decision to withhold relevant information.

In preparation to comment on REGDOC-2.10.1 Greenpeace filed an Access to Information request in 2017 for "...any international benchmarking carried out by CNSC staff to inform the development of DIS-17-01, Framework for Recovery in the Event of a Nuclear Emergency." (A-2017-000141) Unfortunately the CNSC refused to release this benchmarking information.

Greenpeace is not interested in participating in this public consultation given the CNSC feels it can withhold factual information on international approaches related to accident recovery.

Greenpeace urges the Commission to shift its mindset regarding public participation and transparency. Public safety will on be strengthened if the public and civil society groups are provided factual information to assist their review of draft CNSC regulatory guidance.
